

SCHOLARSHIP POLICY

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1. INTRODUCTION

Scholarships are merit-based awards given to pupils who demonstrate exceptional talent, potential, or achievement in specific areas. Danes Hill School offers scholarships in various categories such as academic excellence, arts, sports and music. Scholarships may provide partial fee remission and/or contribution or full support for tuition of the scholarship area.

Scholarships are offered for pupils in Years 3, 5 and 7 and both internal and external candidates may apply.

2. ELIGIBILITY

Scholarship eligibility is determined based on specific criteria related to each scholarship category. The criteria may include academic performance, artistic or athletic achievements, leadership potential, and other relevant factors. The Scholarship Committee, consisting of the Head, Deputy Heads and relevant teaching staff assess each applicant in their chosen discipline. For music awards an external expert may also be invited to be part of the process.

3. APPLICATION PROCESS

Scholarship applications should be submitted to the Head. The application should include relevant supporting documents, such as academic transcripts, portfolios, or letters of recommendation, as required for each scholarship category.

4. SELECTION PROCESS

The school selects the most deserving candidates based on the scholarship criteria. The school's decision is final, and successful applicants are notified in writing. In some cases, shortlisted candidates may be required to attend an interview or audition as part of the selection process.

5. SCHOLARSHIP DETAIL

Scholarships are awarded for the entirety of a child's time at the school as long as they continue to apply themselves fully in their area of scholarship.

The quantum of the scholarship will be set as a percentage of the full fee. In addition, families can apply for bursarial support to supplement the scholarship which may equate to 100% of the total fee. Full details are set out in our Bursary Policy.

Scholars will be supported in several ways to ensure they are able to flourish in their chosen discipline. An annual review with each scholar of their application and commitment will help with planning a support programme to ensure they continue to develop. Being a scholar is not a badge of honour, it is a role that comes with privilege but also responsibility and expectations. The school reserves the right to withdraw scholarship funding if a scholar is not showing the necessary dedication or is not role modelling positive behaviour — within their area of interest or within the wider school community. A scholar failing to meet the standards of behaviour expected may have their status as a scholar removed. They will have moved through a staged review system before reaching this point, unless there are extraordinary circumstances.

A full list of scholarships available are set out in Annex 1 – which will be updated on an annual basis.

The school reserves the right to not award all scholarships if the standard reached is not sufficient. Pupils may apply for multiple scholarships and if appropriate an All-Rounder scholarship may be awarded. There is no limit to the number of scholarships a pupil can receive.

In exceptional circumstances the value of a scholarship may be increased at the point of the award being made or during the pupil's time at the school, following Governor approval.

In addition to the scholarships, parents can apply for bursaries which can be awarded in conjunction with scholarships or as a stand-alone provision up to a maximum of 100% of the fees.
